



In order for the program to run efficiently, it is important that you adhere to the following guidelines.

Current student picture ID

- In order to identify students in the program, you must present a **current** picture ID when registering.

Appropriate Clothing

- Long pants and full length tee shirts. No jewelry. Closed-toe, flat shoes. Long hair must be pulled back.

Camp Etiquette

- Electronic devices are to be turned off during camp.
- Safety is top priority. Teamwork and following instructions by the camp director is a requirement of participating. Any student who is found to be disruptive during camp will be removed and escorted off campus to wait for their parent or guardian. The student will then be removed from the program.
- Parent or guardian is to pick up campers daily by 4 pm.

Pictures

- Pictures will be taken of students during the week for reporting purposes and future programs.
